Intervention Snapshot: A 1-page document highlighting student characteristics and outcomes



Intervention Brief: A 3-4 page document explaining program implementation and processes for evaluating evidence



Intervention Report: A fuller document detailing the research studies



 Explain outcomes for participating students



 Offer key information about the number of studies meeting standards, student enrollment, program implementation and costs, and outcomes

Intervention Reports can answer questions across multiple academic subjects about

- The effectiveness of specific interventions or curricula
- Multiple interventions within a topic area
- Various academic levels
- Different student populations
 For example, Intervention Reports can answer questions like, "What is the effectiveness of Peer-Assisted Learning Strategies in supporting English proficiency among English learner students?" and "What does the research say
- about the effects of dual enrollment courses on college degree attainment?"
