# Achieving outcomes through **three** activities

## Training, coaching, and technical support

- Training on logic modeling and research agendas.
- Technical support to assist with research design, data collection, and/or analysis plans.
- Informal evidence reviews (e.g., using ESSA standards).
- Ask-A-REL responses.

## Applied research

- Descriptive or correlational analyses of extant data.
- Literature reviews.
- Effectiveness studies.
- Technical reports on analytic methods.
- Empirical studies of communication strategies.
- Just-in-Time research.

- REL website.
- Light-touch outreach.
  - Newsletters.
  - Social media.
  - Infographics.
  - Webinars.
  - Short videos.
  - Blog posts.
