
Maryland, New Jersey, and Pennsylvania on the major education challenges in the region.

After launching the REL Mid-Atlantic a few months ago, our first priority was to learn about the needs of our stakeholders in the region. We have been gathering input from a range of key leaders in state education agencies; in rural, suburban, and urban school districts; in schools; and in regional education nonprofits. These conversations have informed the development of a group of collaborative research alliances (described below) that are organized around critical education challenges in the region, and that support the applied research, technical assistance, and dissemination activities we will be undertaking alongside our stakeholders.

We will continue to monitor needs and gather input from many sources in the region, to ensure that all of our work is useful and addressing stakeholders' most pressing priorities. We look forward to hearing from you about your own pressing priorities and the ways the REL might be able to help.


