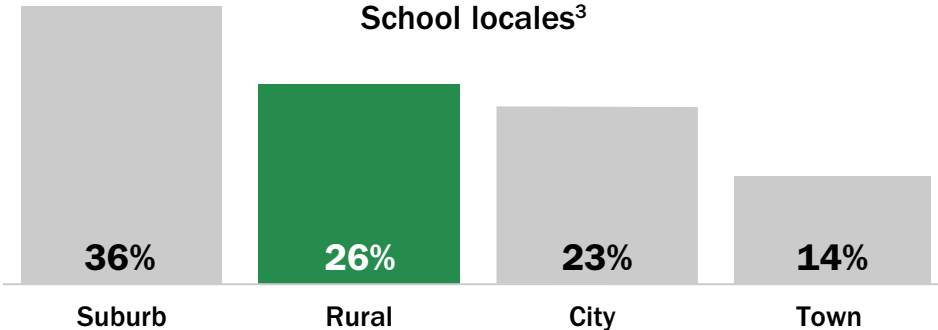

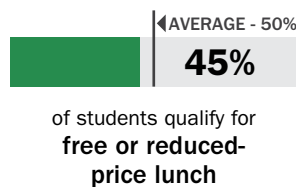

State Education Priority
