

Educator Diversity Matters

Black teachers improve outcomes for Black students





Black teachers have higher academic expectations of Black students than do white teachers.¹ Black students with Black teachers have higher reading and math scores.² Black students with Black teachers are more likely to be enrolled in gifted, honors, and AP courses.³ Black teachers have more positive perceptions of Black students' behavior⁴ and are less likely to suspend them.⁵ Black students with at least one Black teacher in grades K-3 are 13% more likely to graduate and 19% more likely to enroll in college than their same-race same-school peers.⁶


But not enough students have access to them

Black students made up about 15% of public school students in the U.S., while only 7% of teachers are Black.

As a whole, students of color made up almost half of public school students in the U.S., while only 19% of teachers are of color.⁷



Students and teachers of color as a percentage of all students and teachers. Students and teachers of color are defined as those who are Black, Latinx, Native, Pacific Islander, or two or more races.

CONNECTICUT

Connecticut developed a guidebook to support districts and schools in their efforts to increase the racial, ethnic and linguistic diversity of the teacher and leader workforce.⁸

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REL Northeast & Islands and the Region 2 Comprehensive Center provided coaching to districts as they analyzed their recruitment and hiring data and established action plans for diversifying their educator workforce.⁹

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Connecticut surpassed its goal of increasing the number of educators of color by 10%— approximately 1,000 positions—between 2017 and 2021.10

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MASSACHUSETTS

Massachusetts has launched a variety of initiatives to support the diversification of the educator workforce, including:

A grant program that provides tuition support for paraprofessionals and local graduates to enroll in teacher preparation and MTEL preparation courses¹¹

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A guidebook for advancing promising strategies for increasing the diversity of the educator workforce¹²

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A statewide professional learning community to support school and district teams in educator diversity initiatives¹³
