

Let's Read Words and Sentences

Encourage your child to point to the words while reading. If needed, help your child say the sounds in the word and then blend them together to read the word. If more support is needed, model reading each word or sentence first and then have your child read what you read.

1. Ask your child to read the word list.
2. Ask your child to read the paragraph.
3. Help your child with any words that are difficult.
4. Talk about the meanings of the words and paragraphs.

sled slim slip slab slid slop slam	<p>I wanted to sled down the hill. There was a slim chance that I would get hurt. I tried not to slip on the ice as I made my way to the hill. I sat on a slab of cardboard and pushed off! I only slid an inch. The snow was slop so I could not sled. At least I did not slam into anything.</p>
