Student Success Plans



Academic Improvement Plans

Beginning in the 2018/19 school year, each student by the end of eighth grade shall have a student success plan:


- Developed by school personnel in collaboration with parents and the student.
- Reviewed and updated annually.

The student success plan has the following characteristics:

- It is a dynamic working plan that is visited periodically by the student and an advisor or mentor.
- It must be documented in a format and manner that is accessible to the student.

- Part 1: Guide the student along pathways to graduation.
- Part 2: Address accelerated learning opportunities.
- Part 3: Address academic deficits and interventions.
- Part 4: Include college and career planning components.

Public school districts may include community engagement components as part of the public school's student focused-learning system and student success plans.



An individualized education program meets the requirements for the student success plan if it

- Addresses academic deficits and interventions for students not meeting standards-based academic goals at an expected rate or level.
- Includes a transition plan that addresses college and career planning components.
