Initial considerations for planning a survey

Project planning



Gain consensus on the goals of the survey.



Define the target population.



Identify subgroups of interest.




Consider who will provide the most accurate data.







Outline survey topics. Align and limit content to the goals.



Define survey constructs.

- Training and support
- Feedback on program components
- Interactions with teachers or mentors

Identify other sources of data.

- Interviews
- Existing administrative data
- Focus groups
- Cognitive interviews
