Supporting Principals Using Teacher Effectiveness Data Video-Based Workshop

Objectives

Participants engaging in this video-based workshop will:

- Learn how teacher effectiveness data can be used to inform strategic workforce and professional learning decisions at the school level.
- Practice making decisions regarding teacher assignment, leadership, and professional development.
- Strategize about ways to address barriers to using teacher effectiveness data.

Audience

This video-based workshop is designed for a team of local education agency (LEA) staff responsible for helping principals use teacher evaluation data to inform workforce decisions, including those working in departments responsible for human resources and professional development.

Time

The video is 25 minutes long and includes multiple places to pause, review handouts, and discuss and complete activities with colleagues. The workshop will take between one and two hours to complete depending on the length of discussions.

Materials

There are five handouts associated with this workshop. - We recommend users take advantage of opportunities to stop and discuss when prompted to do so in the video, which is designed to support a structured conversation.
- When completing the activities with the mock data, assure participants that there is no one right answer. The point of the activity is for participants to see how the data might be used differently depending on the local context.
