Education Across America: At A Glance



Interested in the condition of education in different parts of the U.S.? The Education Across America: At A Glance online tool allows users to compare key statistics across cities, suburbs, towns, and rural areas. Users can compare findings under categories such as family characteristics, education experiences, school resources and staffing, and educational outcomes.

Using data from the National Center for Education Statistics, the online resource also includes 140+ tables with data disaggregated by locale. This <u>video walk-through</u> highlights different features of the online tool.

The Regional Educational Lab Program: Making a Difference in Educator Recruitment and Retention

The second blog of a four-part series, the National Center for Education Evaluation (NCEE) highlights four REL partnerships that are addressing <u>teacher recruitment and retention</u>.

In the blog, read about REL Northwest's work with Lower Kuskokwim School District in Alaska, in addition to REL Central's work in South Dakota, REL Pacific's work in Palau and REL Southwest's work in Louisiana.

All four partnerships aim to support partners in decreasing teacher vacancies. Though 2023–24 data is not yet available, IES's National Center for Education Statistics survey showed that45 percent of schools reported having at least one vacant teacher position more than one month into the start of the 2022/23 school year.
