Who We Serve: The Pacifc Region

REL Pacific partners with educators and policymakers in American Samoa, the Federated States of Micronesia (FSM), Guam, Hawai'i, the Commonwealth of the Northern Mariana Islands (CNMI), the Republic of Palau, and the Republic of the Marshall Islands (RMI). Our work is rigorous, change-oriented, and high-leverage, supporting local and regional priorities and decisions about education.

How We Help

Our partnerships with key stakeholders aim to develop and apply evidence that can help educators, school and system leaders, and policymakers achieve significant long-term improvements in organizational effectiveness, educator practice, and student outcomes. We provide evidence-based training, coaching, and capacity building services to educators and school leaders throughout the region, and we also support families and community organizations who want to improve education policy and practice.

Regional Partnership Projects

REL Pacific partnerships focus on projects such as place-based education, college and career readiness, data use and literacy, and teacher effectiveness, development, and retention. These partnerships offer significant opportunities to create meaningful changes in teacher practice and student outcomes, while developing evidence-based research and data, useful tools, and practical strategies that address common high-leverage needs across the Pacific Islands and other regions.

This partnership with the Guam Department of Education provides research and evidence-based professional learning opportunities, resources, and implementation supports in order to build the capacity of teachers and instructional coaches to improve the quality of math curriculum and classroom instruction in elementary and middle school grades.7

CNMI Data Wayfinding Partnership for the Improvement of **Literacy Instruction:**

This partnership addresses student literacy and reading proficiency, and aims to increase data literacy for teachers and data-driven decision-making capacity for leaders across the CNMI Public School System.

This partnership with the Hawai'i Public Charter School Network aims to build and sustain a Hawaiian networked improvement community focused on place-based education.

This partnership with the FSM National Department of Education (including four states— Chuuk, Kosrae, Pohnpei, and Yap) addresses system-wide change that aligns national education priorities to reach reading benchmarks, statelevel efforts to implement language policies, and school-level improvement plans and strategies to meet accreditation standards—all to support student academic learning and performance.*

Ala (Pathway) for All Students in American Samoa:

This partnership with the American Samoa Department of Education and American Samoa Community College aims to improve all students' college and career readiness and success.*
