

What Works Clearinghouse Website Video Tour

Welcome to the new What Works Clearinghouse website. We've redesigned the site to make it easier for you to find the information you need. The reports, resources, and tools that you may be familiar with are all included in the new site – but some of them are in a new location. We've also enhanced the existing site to make it easier to find what works for whom. Let's show you around.

On our home page, we've featured Find What Works, our comprehensive source for learning what the WWC reviews of the research say about education programs, products, practices, and policies. Further down on the page, the Quick Links section of the page will take you directly to the WWC's intervention reports, practice guides, and studies reviewed by the WWC.

To navigate the website, select the menu button at the top of the page. In the Find Evidence section, you'll find links to different resources and tools which provide easy to use information from WWC reviews of education research. These are: Find What Works; Educators Practice Guides; Reviews of Individual Studies; and Data from Individual Studies.

Use Find What Works to find evidence from systematic reviews, or a review of all of the available evidence on an intervention. Select a topic to begin your search and see a list of interventions related to that topic, with relevant practice guides and special features listed on the left. From there, you can discover whether the research was conducted in settings that are similar to your own classrooms and schools, compare interventions, and sort the results. Select an intervention to read a WWC summary of the evidence for that intervention.

Practice guides offer practical evidence-based recommendations for educators. Select a practice guide to learn more about the guide's recommendations or download a copy of the guide.

You can select Reviews of Individual Studies to learn whether the WWC has reviewed a specific study. You can filter by topic, WWC rating, or study design, as well as identify studies that contain at least one statistically significant positive finding. Much more information about our review of each study is only a click away.

And you can delve deeper into the data by downloading Data from Individual Studies, including study details and findings for all studies that met WWC standards.

The Search Publications page contains all WWC practice guides and intervention reports. Navigate here using the menu button. Search for a publication by keyword, topic, or product type. Select an intervention report to see a snapshot of the evidence supporting that intervention or read the full report.

The new website also has a section dedicated to the WWC handbook and other resources. Here you'll find current and older versions of the WWC design standards and review protocols, briefs that dive into different WWC standards in detail, and links to webinars that can help you understand how to design studies that will meet WWC standards. Visit the Study Review Guide page to download the guide that certified reviewers use to assess studies against WWC design standards.
