Poster and Technology-Based Demonstration Abstract Submission Guidelines

Poster and technology-based demonstration sessions provide an opportunity to present and discuss work funded by the National Center for Education Research (NCER), the National Center for Special Education Research (NCSER), and the Small Business Innovation Research (SBIR) program.

For this year's PI Meeting, we are accepting submissions for both traditional posters as well as technology-based demonstrations of products (e.g., online or technology-based intervention, curriculum, assessment, or program). If you are interested in presenting your IES-funded research as part of a poster and technology-based demonstration session at the IES PI Meeting, please complete [this form](#) and submit by Thursday, October 31, 2024.

Who can submit abstracts?

- All NCER and NCSER grantees and SBIR contractors who have substantial results to report may submit abstracts.
- NCER and NCSER predoctoral and postdoctoral fellows and early career researchers are strongly encouraged to submit abstracts.
- Abstract submissions will be limited to one abstract per grant or SBIR contract unless the research is part of a Predoctoral or Postdoctoral Training grant or a Research and Development (R&D) Center grant, in which case there may be up to three submissions per grant. Multiple fellows per Predoctoral or Postdoctoral Training grant will be allowed to submit abstracts, provided they are not presenting the same research.
- Abstract submissions will be limited to one per primary author/presenter.
- The presenter should be available on the date and time scheduled.

How will abstracts be selected?

- Due to space constraints, not all posters and technology-based demonstrations may be accepted for presentation.
- IES and the conference planning team will review each properly completed submission for its scientific merit and significance.
- Priority will be given to posters that show clear alignment with the meeting theme and/or sub-themes, and/or focus on engaging attendees in discussion about challenges, research design, or results. Further, the selection of posters and technology-based demonstrations will be made with the aim of representing the broad portfolio of IES-funded projects in terms of content areas and research programs.
- Abstracts submitted by early career researchers, including fellows in the IES Predoctoral or Postdoctoral Research Training Program and IES Early Career grant recipients, will be given priority to ensure maximum participation.
- Notification of selected or non-selected submissions will be emailed to submitters by Monday, November 18, 2024.

What if I want to correct my abstract or submit a late abstract?

- Modifications/corrections to abstracts can be made by submitting a new form. The newest submission will automatically replace the previous submission.
- Only abstracts submitted online by the submission deadline will be considered.
